Starfish students were very busy during the month of May. We started our month continuing learning about different types of insects and bugs. We learned that insects have six legs, unlike the spider who has eight; and that caterpillars turn into butterflies and moths. We were able to see different caterpillars and ladybugs on the fennel growing in God's Garden.

The second week of May was all about Moms! The children made a beautiful present for their mothers by creating butterflies, hearts, and

flowers using their handprints. The artwork was framed with thumbprint flowers, and "signatures" of the students on the back of the frame.

The last few weeks of the month we learned about ocean animals. We spent a lot of our learning talking about animals that we could find in the Chesapeake Bay and Atlantic Ocean, and came to agreement that we don't want to encounter a jellyfish or a shark this summer, but we are okay with starfish and dolphins.

Our annual art show was amazing. Starfish students created art inspired by arctic animals, penguins, dinosaurs, and flowers.
