After being home for over six months, it's so nice to be back at All Saints'. The Dolphin's arrived on the first day all masked up and ready to go. We have several new procedures in place, and these little kindergarteners have handled everything so well. I am very proud of each of them.

The first week of school we worked on knocking the rust off at bit, including the teachers. We spent most of the week reviewing academics and introducing new policies. The children also have truly enjoyed getting reacquainted with old friends as well as meeting new ones.



For consistency's sake we try and stick to the same schedule each week. Every day the children arrive, answer the question of the day, and then complete their morning work. Their morning work is usually a page in their math book and a language arts worksheet. After morning work, they have some free play time. During free play time Teacher Teresa and I call up the children individually to read one on one. All the children are at different places and this one on one time lets us pin point the strengths of each child.

On Mondays we spend time in the kitchen, on Tuesdays the children sequence the steps of the recipe we made and write a review. All of the recipes and reviews go in a binder cookbook which will go home at the end of the year. Wednesday is usually an art/craft project. On Thursday we do a science activity. Fridays, we wrap up the week with a review and some Fun Friday activities.



This month in the kitchen, we made applesauce, banana bread, and cookies. The cookies were probably the favorite with applesauce coming in a close second. Apparently, the banana bread "tasted weird". From past experience, we will have to work on finding adjectives other than "yuck" and "delicious".

In Science, the kindergarteners experimented with weighing apples, predicting how many seeds an apple has. and which color apple tasted better. During "B" week we made our own bubble solution and compared it to store bought. The children had an absolute blast making bubbles. I believe we all agreed the homemade solution was far superior than store bought. For "C" week, we soaked pennies in different solutions to see which one cleaned them the best. The children had to hypothesize which solution would work best. They were very surprised with the results.

This month has flown by! We have had so much fun. I want to thank each of you for trusting me with your little one every day. I hope they have enjoyed school as much as I have.

Welcome Back Sea Otters!

We jumped right back into learning the moment the children entered into the school. Our first week the Sea Otters focused on classroom expectations and "All About Me". They made family trees and self-portraits. It was fun way to learn about each of our Sea Otters' families. The second week we focused on colors, spelling their names, and learning about the attributes of shapes. Each day of the week we dressed in a certain color and we had a craft that matched the day's color.

In language arts, we read so many books! We learned the parts of the book: front cover, title page, dedication page, pages, back cover and the spine of the book. We discussed the purpose of an author and illustrator. All of the Sea Otters can now tell you if the book is non-fiction or fiction.



This week we just started a letter a day focused on holding the pencil correctly (pinch and flip technique) handwriting starting in the sky and going down to the ground. The Sea Otters are also learning the names of letters and the sounds they make.

In math, we have focused on graphing and learning how to count on a tens frame. "Zero the Hero" made an appearance on the 10th day of school. He holds the place value in the one column. We are so excited to be able to have the children back in our class and wearing their masks as they are having one on one instruction. Safety is so important to us all! Looking forward to seeing and hearing as the children learn all their phonetic sounds!

The Stingrays are off to a great start!! We had a great first week of school with learning "All About Me". We shared our likes, dislikes and things about ourselves. It was fun to learn things all about our friends.

We also learned about apples. We made apple sauce that was so yummy!!!! We also did a taste test of which apples we liked the best with Gala, Granny Smith, and Red Delicious varieties. Also, we painted with red and green apples for the letter Aa.



We are currently learning about Fall and leaves. The Stingrays went on a leaf hunt and figured out what kind of leaves we had around our school. When learning about the letter B, we made butterfly magnets.

We are counting out 100 days of school, and we are up to 14 days!! Wow!!

We will begin the letter Cc and its sounds too. October will also bring learning about pumpkins and Halloween! Thank you so much for all your support this year so far! We are truly off to a fantastic start! We love our Little Stingrays!

Starfish students were busy during the month of September learning about the letters M, A, and F, the circle shape, colors red and yellow, and the numbers one and two.

The first week of school we focused on learning the routine of the classroom. Every day the students came in to the building, put away their snacks, washed hands, and went into the classroom to start their day. They learned that every day we follow the same schedule.

Free Play, Circle Time, Bathroom Break, Snack, Playground, and then Carpool. They also had lessons with Miss Mercedes for Spanish, Coach Jess for Kid Fit, and Music with Teacher Dana.

The second week of we started our "All About Me" unit. The students brought in photo collages of their families and shared them with their classmates. We discussed different types of feelings and talked about how it is okay to be sad, happy, afraid, or excited. We sang, "Parts of Our Body," to the tune of "Skip to My Lou." The children made paper dolls of themselves, and we read books about our feelings.



Our Apple unit was taught the third week of September. We discussed the different parts of an apple and the students identified the stem, skin, flesh, core, and seeds. We sorted apples by color, observed and weighed the apples, saw whether they would float or sink, and tasted the skin and flesh of an apple. We even made an apple explode by hollowing out the middle and putting in baking soda and vinegar. We sang, "The Apple Man," which reinforced the letter A, and we made homemade applesauce. The students made fall trees using apple halves as stampers to decorate the bare limbs.



The last week of the month we learned about the season, Fall. We discussed how the days get shorter and the weather gets cooler. We talked about how the leaves on the trees change colors. We introduced our Circle Time song about the seasons, and acted out our song about leaves falling during the season. We read the book, <u>We're Going on a Leaf Hunt</u>, and went outside and found different colored leaves. The children painted leaves and pressed them on paper to make a beautiful fall art project.

We are very proud of how our students have transitioned into our class after being home for six months. It has been an amazing September, and we can't wait to see what October will bring. It's so great to back in school!!!

September was such a successful and busy first month of school! Most of the Sea Turtles have acclimated well and are happily settled into the routine of our school day. Thank you for the photos. The family pictures are displayed on our "Family Wall", and the students like to look at them and talk about them! Our letters for the month of September were "Aa", "Ff", and "Hh". Our color was red, our shape was the circle, and our number was "1". We sang "Pop See Ko" and read Dr. Seuss' <u>Ten Apples Up On Top</u>. The students enjoyed gluing and counting ten apples on top of the pictures that you gave to us! We hope that



you enjoyed the children's handprints and poems that we did during the first two weeks of school. The students also painted/decorated fish for our "O"fish"ally A Preschooler" bulletin board. We will not be sending the fish home until after April's art show (fingers crossed)! The students also enjoyed decorating the letters "A" and "F" with apples, letter stamps, letter stickers, fish, feathers, and flowers. We will review again in October and expose the students to more letters, numbers, shapes, and concepts. In addition, I will be doing one-on-one assessments with the students (letters, numbers, shapes, and colors). I'm excited about the following months! Thank you for sharing your children with us! ©



In September, the theme for music was Animals. We enjoyed pretending to jump like kangaroos, frogs, monkeys and rabbits. I read the book <u>The Very Busy Spider</u> by Eric Carle and the children acted out the story while listening to Bach's Concerto in a minor for Four Harpsichords: <u>Bach Concerto for 4 Harpsichords</u>

There are quite a few animals in this story. Ask your child which one was their favorite.



On days when the weather is fine, music will be held outside so that we have plenty of room to move around. During September, we played a lot of movement games. The children had to use their listening skills for the game Go and Freeze. As long as I am saying the word GO, they can move around in any way they choose but once I say FREEZE, everyone must stop and freeze. Another version of this game is Shake and Freeze. I shake a tambourine while everyone shakes just one body part such as one hand or foot. When I stop shaking the tambourine, everyone freezes.



We also moved our bodies to "The Walk Around Song", found here: Walk Around--by Nancy Kopman

We started practicing keeping a steady beat with this chant:				
Rickety, rockety, rackety, reel	Will you say your name for me?	Everyone got a turn to clap his or her name.		

Using the song "Roll the Bobbin up", we started learning the musical terms for slow (Largo), medium (Andante), and fast (Presto). Ask your child which speed they prefer!

("Colorful Pito") It's kind of like "Eenie Meenie Miney Moe," and two children in each class are selected every Friday so we can look at the colors they are wearing. It's a simple game, but fun and children love to be the "Pito Pito" of the week! We will continue to review numbers throughout the year as well, so they can identify numbers in Spanish when they are out of order...mmmm...not that easy for little people! Kindergarteners started their

"Days of the Week" lesson last week.

As for songs, we have been dancing to "Baila con Tu Cuerpo" ("Dance With Your Body") and "Las Partes del Cuerpo," ("The Parts of the Body") both related to vocabulary about our body. As soon as we are done with our color lessons, we will start our body lessons, and by then, they should be pretty familiar with that vocabulary. Kindergarteners are also singing "Los Dias de la Semana" ("The Days of the Week").
