## Safety Is Paramount!



The safety of all children is of the utmost importance to the staff at ASDS. To that end, we continue to evaluate our emergency preparedness plans and protocols to ensure appropriate procedures are in place to best protect the children when they are in our care. I recently participated in a specialized training for early childhood professionals around violence and active shooter situations. The training was conducted by experts from the Institute for

Childhood Preparedness. The training provided a deeper understanding of active shooter situations, provided strategies on how to best prepare and tips to respond effectively should a situation warrant actions. While the odds of an active shooter event are extremely low (we are much more likely to get hit by lightning), I do want to ensure we are prepared for all types of emergencies, including unthinkable incidents like this.

As a parent you play a big role in this process! Continuing to let me know when you see someone or something questionable, making sure your emergency contact information is current, letting us know about changes in your family (divorce/custody situations, new babysitter or pick up person) are easy ways for us to protect your child(ren). Thank you for entrusting your child(ren) to our care. It has been such a joy to watch them blossom and grow this year!
