What does PATTCH do?

PATTCH adds to our children's school experience by organizing fun and memorable events, teacher appreciation week, community service projects, and fundraisers. We raise money for new school equipment, maintaining the playground, and any other necessary supplies.

Typically, parents sign up early in the school year to chair, co-chair, and serve as committee members for each event. With this year being a bit different, we'd like to focus on the first half of the year right now. The Stingray's are so excited to be back in school! The month of September has flown by! We started the year off by learning our routines, new classroom rules, and getting to know each other. It's been a great start to the new year! We are learning our new Alphabet Song, counting how many days of school there have been, and learning our individual classroom jobs. Starfish students were busy during the month of September learning about their classroom, classmates, apples, and fall. We spent the first week focusing on the routines of the class. Each day our students put their snacks in their cubbies, washed their hands, moved their fish to let us know they were present, and began their morning. They learned that every day we followed the same schedule, which involved Free Play, Clean-up, Circle Time, Snack, Playground Time, then Carpool. During the week they were introduced to extracurricular activities each day. They attended Music/Art, KidFit, and Spanish.

The second week of the month we started our *All About Me* unit. The children made picture collages with their families and brought them in to share with the class during Circle Time. We made paper dolls that looked like them. We talked about different feelings and how it is okay to be happy, sad, scared, and many other emotions. We sang songs and read books about feelings and ourselves. The Starfish learned about apples the third week of the month. We discussed the different parts of an apple and where they come from. We tasted different types of apples and discussed how they tasted. Applesauce, Apple-Cinnamon bread, and apple nachos were made and eaten. We made apple trees using apples halves as stamps, and we made an apple explode using baking soda and vinegar. We sang, "*Do You Know the Apple Man?*", and recited a poem about an apple falling on their noses.

Since the last week of the month was the first full week of fall, we started our unit about this season. We discussed how the days get shorter and the weather gets cooler, how the leaves on the trees begin to turn different colors, and we sang a song about the leaves falling. We read <u>We're Going on a Leaf Hunt</u> and went outside and collected leaves that had already fallen. We made fall wreaths using paper plates, leaves cut from watercolor paper, and watercolor paint.

We were able to introduce the letters M, A, and F, the colors yellow and red, the numbers 1 and 2, and the circle shape during this busy month.

We are very proud of all of our students and how well they have transitioned into the Starfish class this month. We can't wait to see what the month of October brings to our class.

It has been such a blessing to be able to join ASDS and share some of my gifts with the children (and teachers). Here is a glimpse of what we have been working on this month:

On the music side, the children have enjoyed learning about high and low sounds while playing on pitched instruments, listening to high and low sounds and, of course, dancing the High-and Low Dance. The older children had a lot of fun listening to the story of <u>The Three Little Pigs</u> and re-telling the story with high and low sounds. We also explored big and small instruments and found that small instruments make a higher pitched sound than bigger instruments. On the art side of the studio, the Sea Otters created self-portraits, which were mounted on a background of bleeding tissue paper. This kind of process art took several sessions and will be on display in the studio. The Sea Otters will create another self-portrait at the end of the school year. The Starfish worked on collaborative process art: Teacher Sandra brought in a large canvas, the children applied painters' tape and then used black sharpies to 'sign' the canvas. Afterwards they used tempera paint sticks to color all over the canvas. The piece of work was then named and will be on display in the studio. The Stingrays listened to a story of an artist and then worked on a picture with watercolors and tempera paint sticks. The studio is an ever-evolving place, I really enjoy our children who bring so much curiosity and potential to this wonderful space.

The Starfish class is very attentive, and they are learning fast! They are doing a great job with their Colors lesson. As for songs, we have been dancing to "Baila Con Tu Cuerpo" (Dance with your Body) and "Las Partes del Cuerpo" (The Parts of the Body). We have also been singing along with two different videos about numbers. The students really enjoy that!

Happy Fall everyone!


